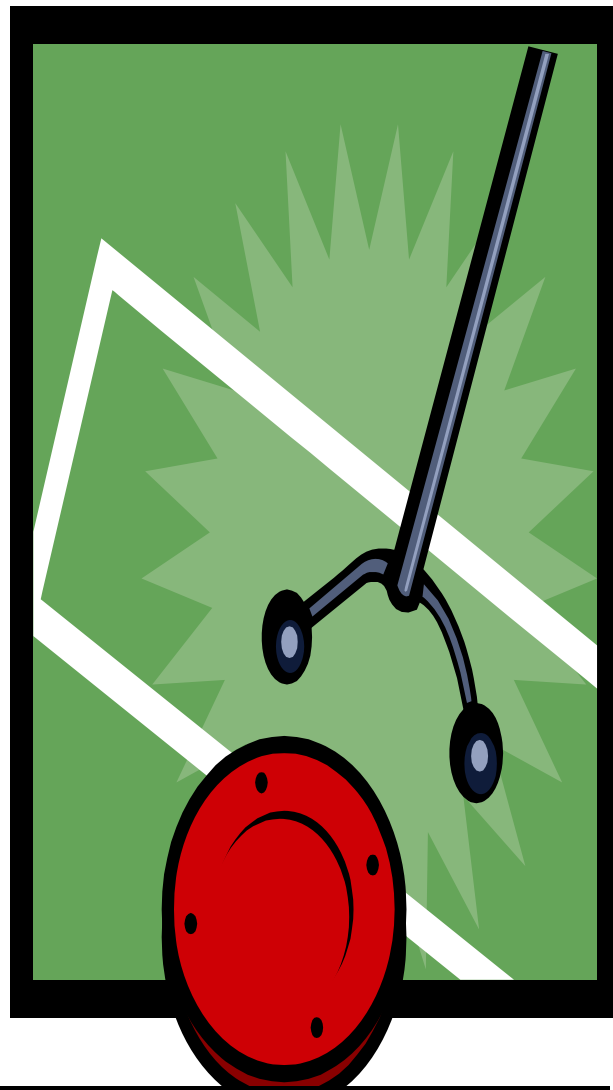
Teri scored a new high of 30 points with two eights and 2 sevens.
